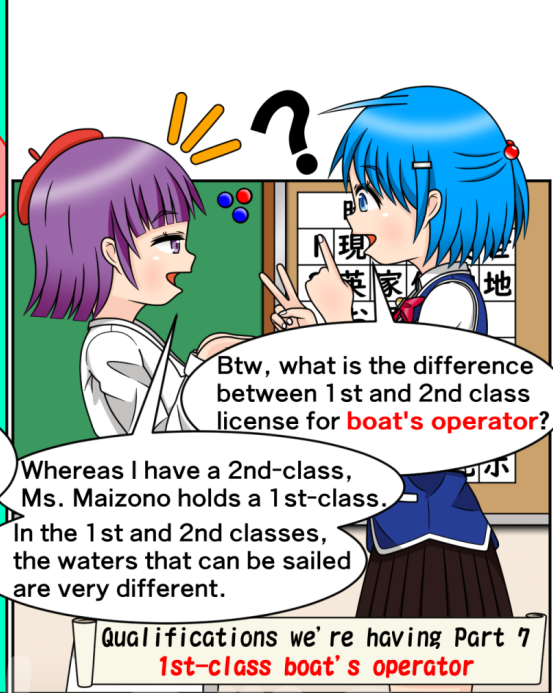




The 2nd-class navigable waters are limited to **5 nautical miles** from the shore, while the 1st-class has **no such limitation**.
 So, if you have the 2nd-class, you can sail across Tokyo Bay, but you can't sail across Sagami Bay.



Btw, what is the difference between 1st and 2nd class license for **boat's operator**?

Whereas I have a 2nd-class, Ms. Maizono holds a 1st-class. In the 1st and 2nd classes, the waters that can be sailed are very different.

O.K. I'll be satisfied with fishing in waters where fishery rights are not within reach. Please get the 1st-class ASAP. ♥

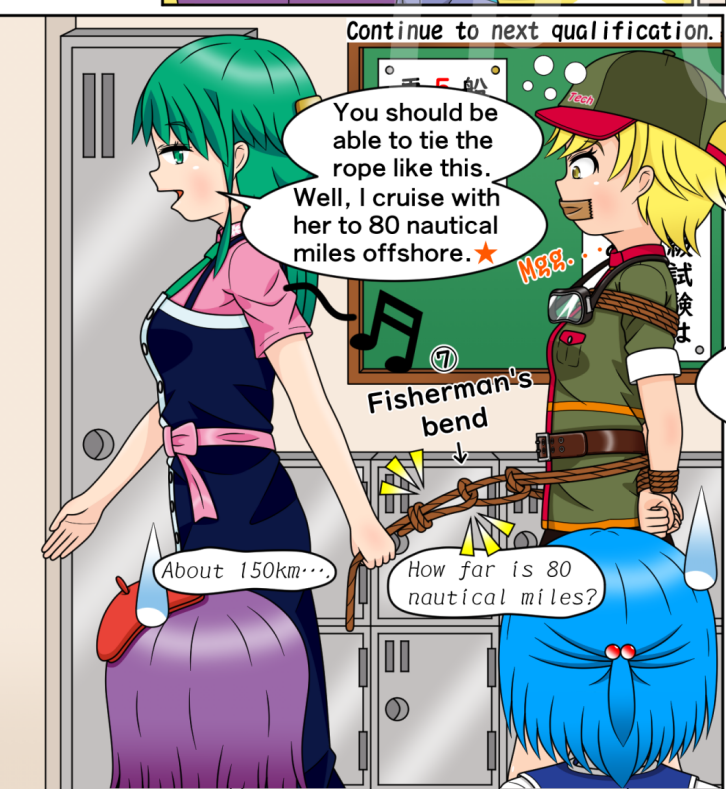
Unfortunately, we can't get the 1st-class until we're **18 years old**.

If you get the 1st-class, can you *haunt* anywhere in the world by boat?

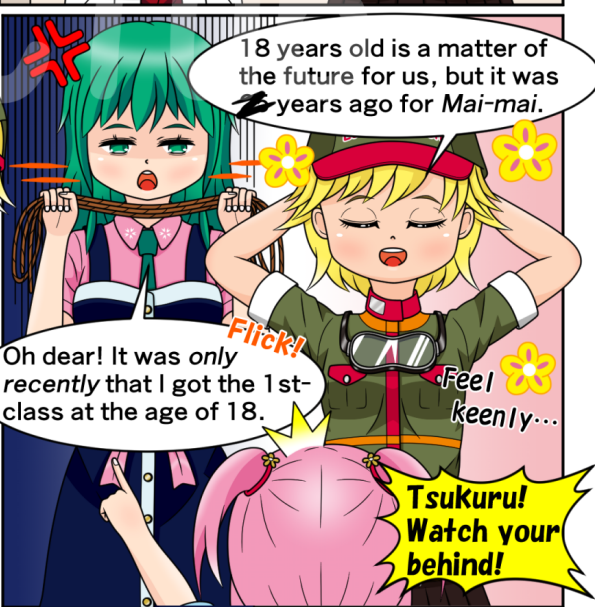
No. If you sail more than **80 nautical miles** from shore, you must accompany an **engineer** on your boat.
