If teachers give me per-mission, I'll paint effective notice★

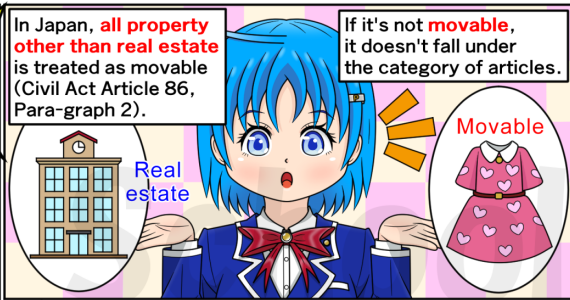
Our school was warned by local residents that it was dangerous because our students were running out of the school gate.

In Japan, all property other than real estate is treated as movable (Civil Act Article 86, Para-graph 2).

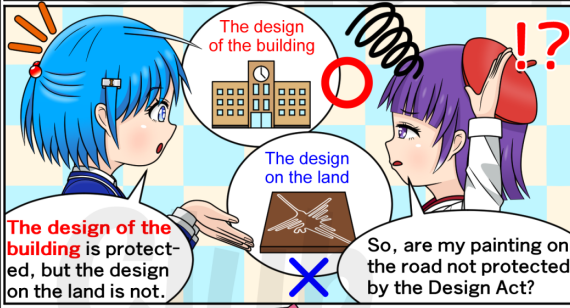
If it's not movable, it doesn't fall under the category of articles.
